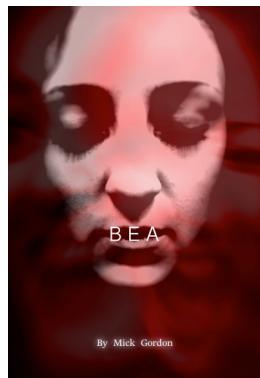

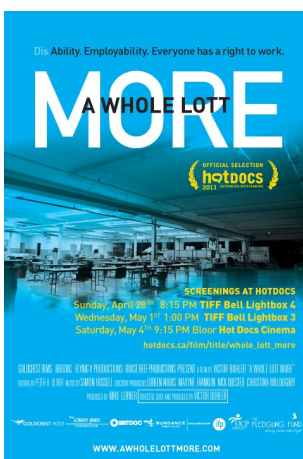

Many talented CVS artists were featured including: Donna Worotyne, Neil Clifford, Quyen Ngo, Conrod Skyers, Lisa Tuckwell, Betsy Pattinson, John Freddy Salazar, Melanie Crawford and Jack Southern. Their latest and greatest artistic works were all proudly on display.

Arts Etobicoke was established in 1973 and is recognized as one of Canada's finest community arts councils. It's vision is to help unite and provide a voice to the local arts community in Islington Village. It is also conveniently situated a few units east of CVS and has naturally formed a fruitful partnership with CVS artists and staff.

Back in 2011, CVS became part of

“Art on the Move”; a 3 year inter-generational community arts project hosted by Arts Etobicoke and Lakeshore Arts. The project involved transforming 13 vehicles into a dazzling fleet of moving canvasses of art by covering them with large adhesive “art wrap” panels.

With facilitation from Denise St. Marie and Harold Tomlinson and designs from talented CVS artists, one of Community Living Toronto's maintenance vans received the art wrap treatment.

CVS artists never sit idle as they will be participating in the upcoming Contact Photography Festival from May 1 to 31. CVS is also working on another project with Arts Etobicoke. Be sure to look for details in a future edition of Connections.

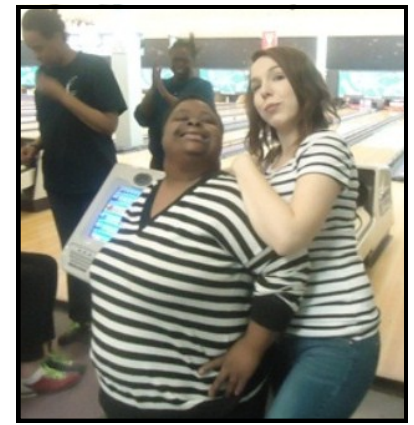

Every two years, people with intellectual disabilities get together at Foster's Club House and elect Community Living Toronto's Self-Advocates Council (SAC).

The Self-Advocates Council is a group of 13 members, who have an intellectual or developmental disability, and care about others with disabilities. They meet monthly, and talk about what is important to them. They meet as a group with staff support. They learn about human rights. They discuss how to make things better for people with intellectual disabilities. June 17 is the election date for the Self-Advocates Council. Come run for the council! Or come and vote!

Paul Cochrane who has been a long

time member of the council is encouraging new people to join. "Come to a meeting and we can tell you about it! It's open to everybody. It doesn't matter who you are – you are welcome! We don't judge people!"

If you have an intellectual or developmental disability, you could run for council. People are invited to nominate themselves. You can do a speech to your peers at the Club House. Everyone is then given a chance to vote on who they want in council.

For example, did you know that Community Living Ontario now has sections of their website devoted to employers, inclusive education information for families as well as their section on advocacy for the sector? Our Community Living Toronto website, <http://cltoronto.ca>, is constantly being updated, too. We have a section on useful resources for families and one on fee for services. Under the resources section there is information and direct links to ConnectABILITY.ca, LIGHTS (a program devoted to facilitating new housing opportunities), Spinclusion (an interactive game that prompts acceptance and respect for people with different needs and abilities) and funding application options. In the fee for service

section, there are links to information about the Community Junction and Creative Village Studio. In the coming months, we will be expanding the use of our website to bring you up to date information on membership sponsored programs too.

ConnectABILITY.ca has also gone through a number of updates and changes in the past year. The Connected Families section is a really great place to go to discuss what concerns you. Recently, a lively inter-active discussion took place on how youth with intellectual disabilities are using the internet to meet people to and have relationships. This started a discussion among parents who were concerned about this practice and were looking for suggestions on safer ways for their children to meet potential friends. The discussion included a lot of good suggestions put forward by parents who are dealing with this issue themselves.
