



Developmental Services Sector Agencies Partner to Receive Employment and Modernization Fund

(TORONTO – Thursday, March 12, 2015) –Christian Horizons, Community Living Toronto, Corbrook, Meta Centre, Kerry's Place Autism Services, Reena, and Vita Community Living Services & Mens Sana Families for Mental Health has received an \$800,250 grant from the Ministry of Community and Social Services' Employment and Modernization Fund to fund a collaborative online Fee-for-Service Hub that will be used by 37 agencies across the developmental services sector.

The government's investment of \$800,250 over a two year period will allow the seven organizations to work together to:

- Create a collaborative model to build capacity for real time, individualized, fee for service options by not-for-profit agencies
- Create a go-to, central point of contact for families and individuals to find and register for options
- Strengthen the existing support resources that exist at www.connectABILITY.ca for all stakeholders
- Provide agencies the tools and supports to enhance or start offering fee for service options

"This project reflects a collective and shared vision of community service agencies to support access and choice for individuals with developmental disabilities and their families while protecting the quality of service," says Bryan Keshen, President and CEO, Reena "Reena is pleased to be part of a pilot team developing a model that will enable a province wide approach to improving access to quality programs for individuals and families."

This fund is part of the Ontario government's \$810 million investment strategy for community and developmental services. It will support the ongoing transformation of the developmental services sector towards greater inclusion and independence for individuals, and to encourage agencies in identifying and providing new approaches and innovative services and supports for individuals with developmental disabilities.
